Bishop Raphael Umemura lauded the joy of Christ's birth as he celebrated Christmas Eve Mass in Futaba High School at 8 pm. Before the mass, there was carol singing by a joint choir comprising parishioners belonging to the Japanese congregation and those belonging to the international congregation.

In the present day scenario, the Bishop said, "Commercialism has stolen the true meaning of Christmas and in the darkness of deception and of the times we live in, we need the light of Christ to guide us... we decorate the Cathedral with lights as a symbol of Christ in our lives."

"Christ, our Savior, came into the world as a light to guide us", the bishop continued. "To bring light means to also bring peace, to work for peace, for the poor, for the suffering... we also pray for all of them, especially the typhoon victims in the Philippines, for those separated from loved ones, for those in pain and in darkness, we must pray for them. Similarly as Christians, we are called to be lights in the world", concluded the bishop as he delivered his homily in the auditorium packed to capacity with the faithful.
